RESOLUTION 2021-5 YEAR END REPORT – 2020

STORM WATER MANAGEMENT UPDATE

Mr. Rohmeyer gave a brief summary of the NJDEP Update to the Storm Water Control Ordinance. The most notable change is they are now incorporating green infrastructure as a requirement in any major development. The intent is to design facilities that use or limit the natural water cycle to capture, filter, absorb, and reuse storm water. Instead of one large detention basin, sites will have smaller basins and rain gardens.

Mr. Vreeland made a motion to send a letter to the Borough Council stating we approve the updated amendment. Mr. McAndrew seconded the motion. On roll call vote, all members voted yes. The motion was passed.

ADJOURN

There being no further business, a motion was made by Jim McAndrew, seconded by Keith Vreeland and unanimously agreed to adjourn the meeting.
