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Mr. Martin moved, second by Mr. Vreeland that Resolution #47-23 be approved as read. It was so moved by the unanimous consent of Council.

Mr. Colangelo announced that Christmas Trees can be disposed of by either bringing it to the yard or calling for brush pick up and then putting it to the curb. He also reminded everyone to sign up for Nixle Alerts for storms and alerts from the town.

Mrs. Taylor moved, second by Mr. Colangelo that the minutes of the meetings of December 19, 2022 be approved. It was so moved by the majority consent of Council. Mr. D'Amore abstained from voting.

Mr. Vreeland moved, second by Mr. Martin that the meeting be opened to the public.

Paul Solomani, Paradise Cove, stated the Paradise Cove and Upland Residents association is taking off and his attorney advised the governing body that Thompson Creek can be considered for infrastructure funding through the State of New Jersey, and the governing body need to keep pushing to have the creek dredged or else values of homes in Paradise Cove will decrease.
