Finally, she stated that she saw kittens in the newspaper in Egg Harbor City if anyone is interested. She stated that she has gotten two cats from there and has the article if anyone wants more information.

- Mr. Martin, on behalf of the Pride & Celebration Committee, stated that the first summer concert at the Seaport was a success and the second concert has been postponed to August 30th because of inclement weather.
- Mr. Dupuis, on behalf of the Tuckerton Environmental Commission, thanked everyone who participated in the Adopt-A-Highway cleanup.
- Mr. Colangelo moved, second by Mr. Vreeland that the meeting be open to the public.

Paul Solimani, 20 Edgewater Drive, ask for Council to waive the fee for the Paradise Cove Sign permit. Mr. Solimani also stated that they would like to put a sign under the stop sign if allowed to warn cars for children if that is allowed. He agreed that the house on fairway should be looked into and does not believe that anyone lives there. He asked for an update on the Thompson's Creek dredging permit and when it expires and also how much it cost to extend the permit. Finally he asked Council what they are going to do to dredge Thompson's Creek.

Mr. Vreeland moved, seconded by Mr. Martin to waive the building and zoning fee for the Paradise Cove Sign. It was so moved.

Chief Olsen said that they are allowed to put a sign on the stop sign.

Mrs. Gleghorn stated that it's a \$500 fee and she has requested more information on it.

Mr. Martin stated that he is waiting for the grant applications to come out for the thin layer deposition project to see if Thompson's Creek would qualify for that and he is also talking to VanDrew's Office.

Carolyn Keen, 84 Curlew Road, stated that the beach had their first TBA concert down at South Green Street Park and it was a success. She stated that the toilets and the trash were really bad though and asked if there is anything the town can do about it for the next concert. She also asked if there is anything that can be done about the traffic in the beach area and if the check valves were put in the new roads. She stated that they have noticed an improvement down on Bass Road and wanted to know whats going on with Little Egg Harbor Blvd. because it is getting dangerous to walk and drive down there with all the manholes that are sinking.

Mrs. Gleghorn stated that she will have Public Works look into it. She also stated that the checked valves did go into the new streets and she agrees that L.E.H. Blvd is bad.

Joshua Delazano, Little Egg Harbor resident, stated that the parking situation is really bad when there are big events going on around town. He suggested maybe putting angled parking down some of the streets like Bartlett or Great Bay or having a Jitney shuttle people from the high school to town during events.

Mr. Martin stated that it's hard to do angled parking because there are lot of Green Acre areas that are protected, but likes the idea of the Jitney and will bring it up to the Pinelands Fourth of July Committee.

James Cramer, 158 Clay Street, stated that they need no wake signs and "s" turns down the creek. He asked if they could get buoys. He also stated that they need "s" turns because boats almost keep crashing into each other and last year 2 kids did crash. Finally he stated that the Marine Police will only take complaints from police departments.

Chief Olsen stated that he did make a request but he will follow up. He also confirmed that complaints have to come from a police department.

Lee Eggert, 121 Willow Landin Terr., stated that he believes that there have been violations with his OPRA requests and claims he will be taking legal action against the clerk's office. He stated that things are being taken out of the minutes which makes things look like opinions. Finally he asked if Council looked into Parkertown at all and gave some examples about them.

Mrs. Obiedzinski-Garvin, 209 Cedar Street, thanked everyone for their kind thoughts and courtesies for her mother and she is overwhelmed with love. She also asked where all the money for the lawsuits being brought against the Borough is coming from.

Anthony Scaglione, stated that there was a TBA meeting on Saturday, wanted to know if the electrical panel down at the park could be made available for the next concert and asked if there was a timeline for the Tuckerton Creek dredging because they were supposed to do the mouths of the lagoons. He also wanted clarification if water was supposed to be doing over the landyard lagoon and wanted to know if they can do anything about the mosquito ditch that is bringing mud back into the lagoon.

Mr. Martin stated that he will reach out to get an update on Tuckerton Creek.

Mrs. Gleghorn stated that she believes the Tuckerton Creek project is in the works but will have to check to make sure.

Mr. Martin confirmed that the water is supposed to go over Landyard Lagoon. The DEP and USFW made our engineer change it for this to happen.

Mr. Martin also stated he is waiting for grant applications to come out to try and help with the mosquito ditch.

Deborah McMunn, 83 Dolphin Road, stated she is concerned about the wildlife in town. She stated that people were catching turtles in Tip Seaman Lake and claimed they were crabbing. She also explained that she witnessed a car purposefully hit a family of geese last week and stated that no one follows the speed limit down in the beach area. Mrs. McMunn also asked if golf carts are allowed down in the beach area and stated that people need to be more aware of what is going on down there. Finally, she stated that she did contact the state police about the turtles and the geese.

Richard William Overton, 232 North Green Street, stated that a lot of turtles get trapped near the waterfall and thinks we should put up a fence to prevent this from happening.

Kaylyn Ullman, 239 South Green Street, stated that she is happy the Borough got a grant for the ballfield and asked if maybe there could be a community garden there. She also stated that the Environmental Commission is interested in being in the 4th of July Parade next year. She stated that the Commission has planned more Adopt-A-Highway cleanups in an effort to get more people involved. Finally, she stated that it is very disheartening to hear about the people going after wildlife and kids almost getting hit.

Mr. Colangelo moved, second by Mr. Vreeland that the meeting be closed to the public.

Mr. Martin moved, second by Mr. Vreeland that the meeting be recessed at 8:15 pm. It was so moved.

Mr. Colangelo moved, second by Mr. Vreeland that the meeting be reconvened at 8:39pm. It was so moved.
